**You can ask "How are you?" in different ways.**

The most common way is "¿Cómo estás?" You use this with friends and family.

If you talk to a teacher or an older person, you say "¿Cómo está?"

This is more polite. With friends, you can say "¿Qué onda?" It means "What's up?"

"¿Qué onda?" is a casual way to say "What's up?" and is used with friends. "¿Qué pasa?" means "What's happening?" and can be casual or serious, depending on the tone. "

How are you?	¿Cómo estás?
How's it going?	¿Cómo te va?
You good?	¿Todo bien?
What's up?	¿Qué pasa?
What's new?	¿Qué hay de nuevo?
How've you been?	¿Cómo has estado?
How've you been?	¿Cómo has estado?
I'm fine, and you?	Estoy bien, ¿y tú?
Not bad.	Nada mal.
So so.	Más o menos.
Ask me later.	Pregúntame más tarde.
As usual.	Como siempre.
It's going well!	¡Va bien!

If someone asks you "¿Cómo estás?", you can answer in different ways. Say "Estoy bien" if you're good. Say "Más o menos" if you feel okay.

If you're tired, say "Estoy cansado" (boys) or "Estoy cansada" (girls).

If you're happy, say "Estoy feliz." It's polite to ask back "¿Y tú?" (And you?).

I've been better.	He estado mejor.
And you?	¿Y tú?
Not great.	No muy bien.
A bit tired, but okay.	Un poco cansado/a, pero bien.
All good.	Todo bien.
Getting by.	Ahí voy.
I'm tired.	Estoy cansado. / <b>Estoy cansada.</b>
I'm tired of you asking me how I am	Estoy cansado/a de que me preguntes cómo estoy.
Thank you for asking.	Gracias por preguntar.
Why do you want to know?	¿Por qué quieres saber?
I'm busy, go away	Estoy ocupado, vete. / <b>Estoy ocupada, vete.</b>
Don't ask	No preguntes.
